

Envelope Punchboard Tea/Coffee Cup

Project based on a video by Linda Parker (www.papercraftwithcrafty.co.uk)

Supplies:

- 1 piece of cardstock (8-1/2" x 9-1/2")
- 1 piece of Designer Series Paper (DSP) (3" x 7-1/2")
- Simply Scored Scoring Board or Paper Cutter w/ scoring blade
- Envelope Punch Board
- Circles Collection Framelits
- 2" circle punch
- Adhesives



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Directions:

Step 1: Score the 8-1/2" x 9-1/2" piece of cardstock as shown in the Diagram A below. Additional photos on next page. (Don't worry about the ovals, they are just there so you can see where you will be punching later)

Step 2: Cut the 3" x 7-1/2" piece of DSP at 1-1/4" intervals as shown in Diagram B below so you end up with 6

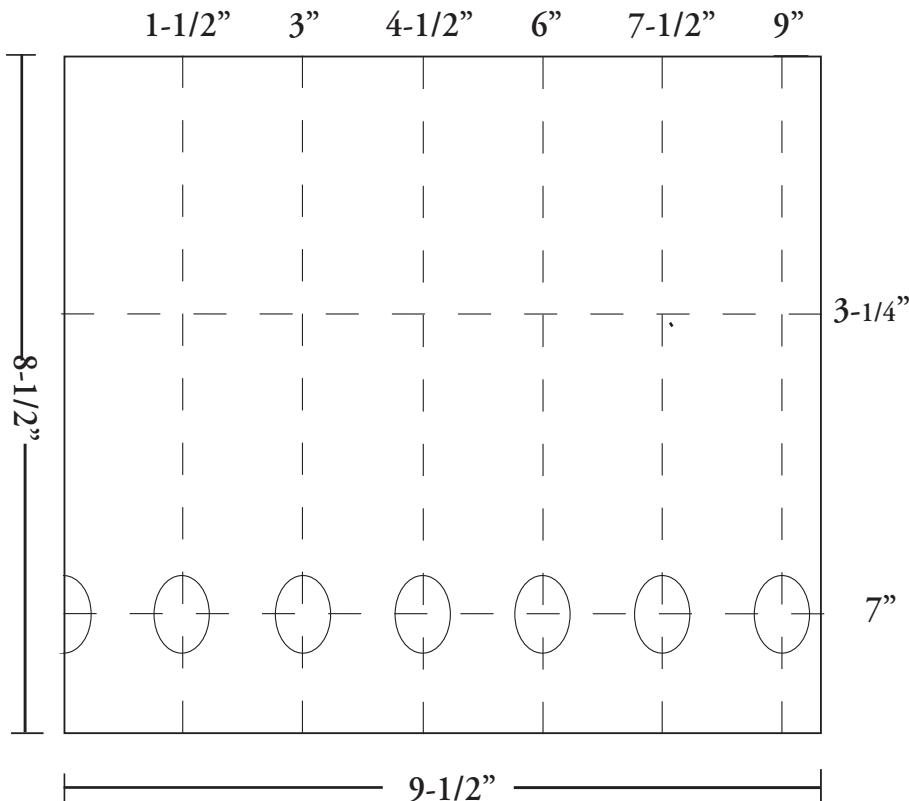

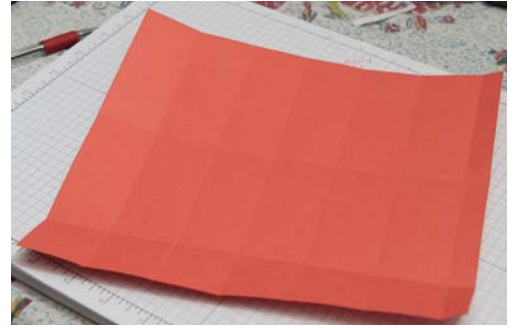

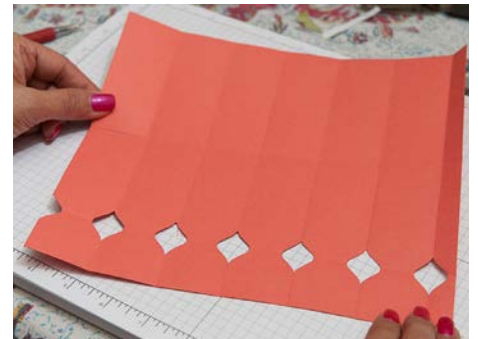
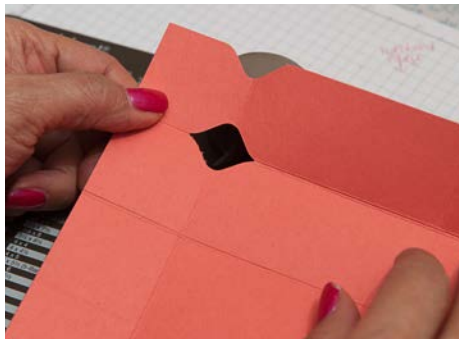
Step 3: Fold cardstock at score lines



Step 4: Place the scored cardstock onto the punchboard and align at the 1-1/2" mark (the score line should be in the middle of the opening). Punch.



Step 5: Fold the cardstock at the next crease and place back onto punchboard at the 1-1/2" mark. Punch again. Continue folding and punching until you get to the end. Your cardstock should end up looking like the one in the photo on the right below.



Oops! Almost missed a step!

Step 5-1/2: Before moving on to Step 6 remember to take the six 1-1/4" x 3" pieces of DSP (from Step 2) and glue them to the other side of the cardstock as shown in the photo to the right before moving on to step #6. Note that my photo shows the last little flap is on the right but actually it will be on the left when you do this. It's hard to see but I aligned the top of the DSP pieces about 1/8" inch below the first horizontal score line and centered each piece left to right between vertical score lines.



Step 6: Make cut along the bottom and snip off at sides as shown below on the left.

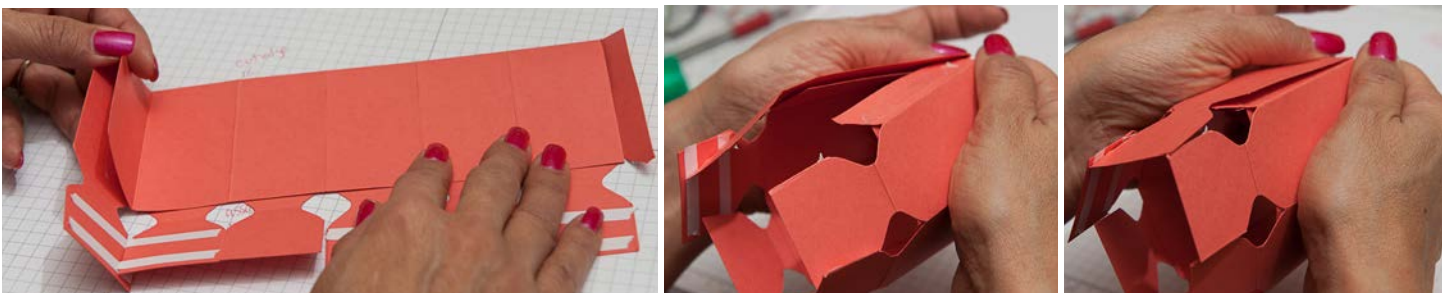
Step 7: Place adhesive as shown in the middle photo below (*note that one flap does not have adhesive*).

Step 8: Put adhesive/glue above the top score line.



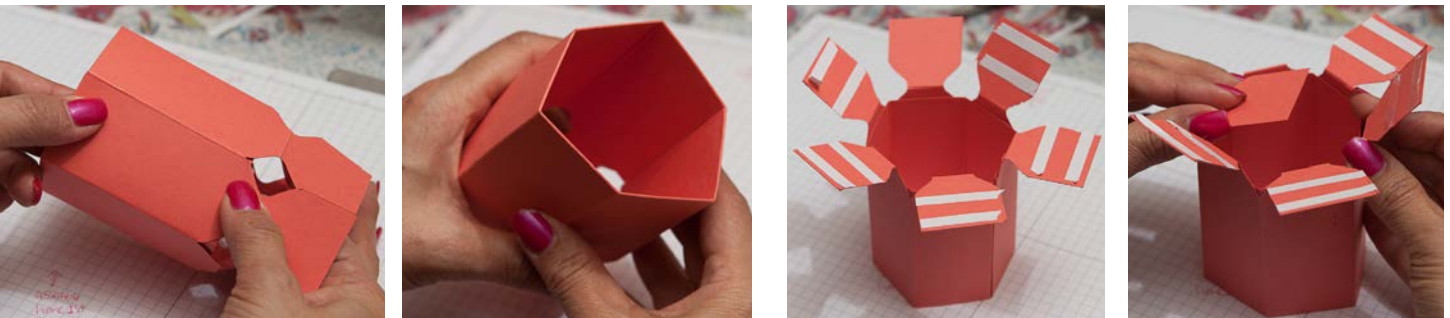
Step 9: Fold top flap down and shown leaving a slight opening on the left to insert tab from other end.

Step 10: Insert the tab into opening as shown and close the gap.



Step 11: Place adhesive on the bottom flaps as shown (*note that one flap does not have adhesive*).

Step 12: Fold down the flap without adhesive first and place opposite flap down over it. (*TIP: if you use your fingers to bend/soften the base of the flaps where it will curve first it will be easier to fold over*)

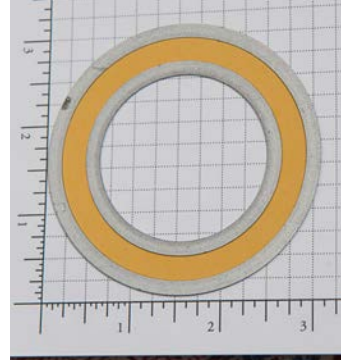


Step 13: Continue with the next 2 layers until the bottom is complete.

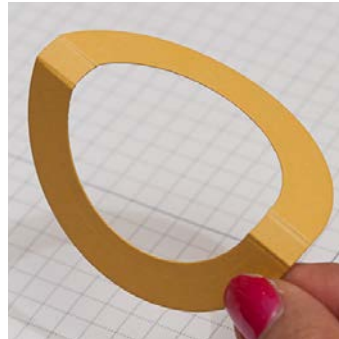


Step 14: Place a 2" punched circle over the bottom to hide the seams.

Step 15: Use the 4th and 6th circle framelits (counting from the inside) to cut the handle piece.



Step 16: Place the handle piece on the scoreboard centered along a middle line and score at 1/8" on both sides of the middle line (see example below). Fold at score lines to form handle. Glue open ends together.



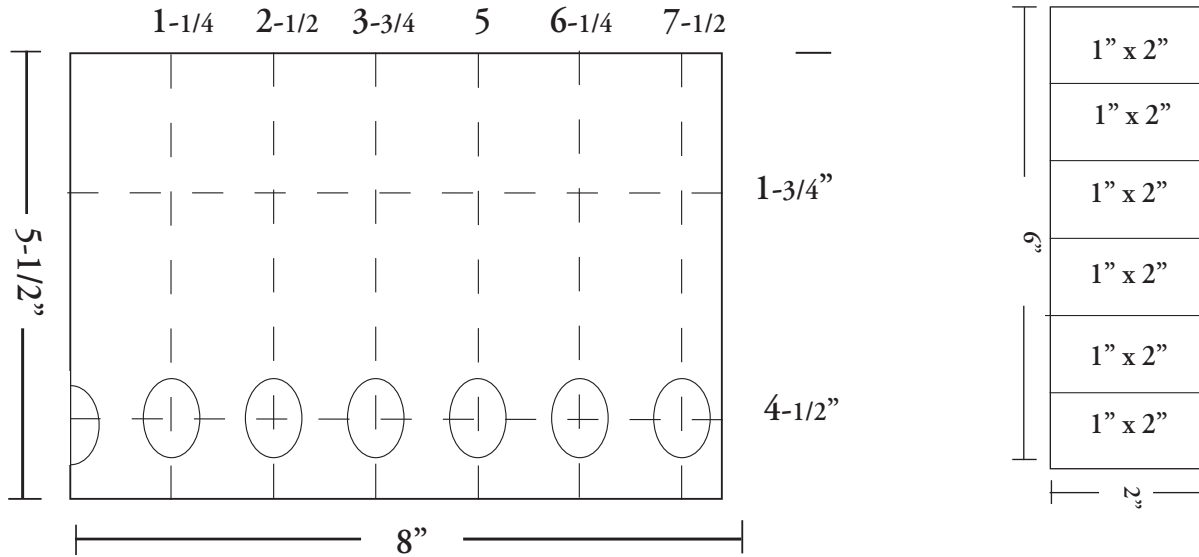
Step 17: Adhere handle to side of cup making sure to use a strong adhesive. **NOTE:** the handle is decorative only and will not hold the weight of the cup if anything is in it.

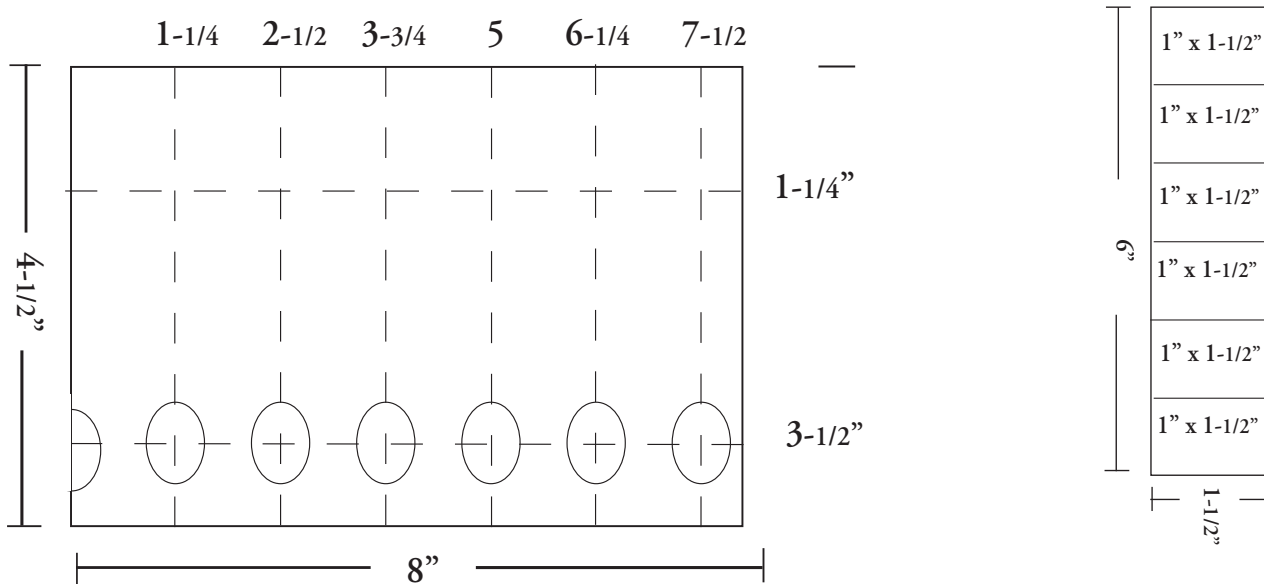


Measurements/cut guides for Medium version



For the handle I used a 1-3/8" and 2" circle punch. For the bottom circle piece, use 1-1/2" circle punch.

Measurements/cut guides for Small version



For the handle I used a 1" and 1-1/2" circle punch. For the bottom circle piece, use 1-3/8" circle punch.
